Tips for Writing Successful Research Proposals and Study Objectives

Strategies

- × Start right away with the topic and focus of your research (no lengthy personal introduction);
- × State the contribution your research will make to the discipline or in terms of its social impact;
- × Demonstrate knowledge in the area of your research (brief review of some recent major theories/research);
- × Mention research that you have done in this area, if any;
- × Show in what way your research connects to the reviewed literature;
- × Give some details about what you plan to do;
- × State clearly what the expected outcome of your research is.

Structure

- × Try not to write more than 1000 words (or two pages);
- × Explain your topic and focus, as well as the contribution of your research in no more than two paragraphs;
- × Show your breadth of theoretical knowledge/mastery in no more than two paragraphs;
- × Provide some details of your research plan in no longer than two paragraphs;
- × State the expected outcome of your research in no more than one paragraph;
- × Keep your paragraphs short, focused, and coherent (no longer than 150 words if possible).

Study objective

- × Introduce who you are (S1 and S2 majors and current academic/professional occupation, research interest);
- × State why you are interested in this research area and why it is important in the context of your discipline/social setting;
- × Demonstrate your knowledge of the state-of-the-art of the research area/discipline;
- × Provide info on how long it will take to finish your study and what steps you plan to take to ensure it;
- × State what your future plan is after you complete your study (relevance & contribution).

Study objective

- × Everything should fit in no more than one page;
- × All sentences and paragraphs must be brief, to the point, and effective;
- × The goal is to foreground your knowledge capability in your research area and your ability to complete your study successfully;
- × Avoid too many jargons and technical terms; while you need to “show off” what you have, it is essential to do it without intimidating your reader.
